We received 23 suggestions for improvement. Here are the main themes in groups:

Lunches 2 comments	Some families would prefer their child to have lunches pre-chosen on the day. We recently sought everyone's feedback on this and the most popular choice was for children to choose on the day. Our youngest children still have meals chosen in advance and will transition to choosing on their own as they get older. If you have any concerns regarding your child's eating, regardless of their age, please get in touch and we can support you.
External Communication 6 comments	<p>We try to give you dates in advance for school events as we appreciate family life and other commitments is extremely busy. Termly dates are on the website and our homepage calendar is always populated. We also put upcoming dates on the weekly newsletter and send reminders out via Arbor.</p> <p>We appreciate some working parents cannot get to events at 3.30pm. We try to change the times available. Where possible (for example workshops related to upcoming examinations for example), we will try to send a PowerPoint home with the teacher's voiceover.</p>
