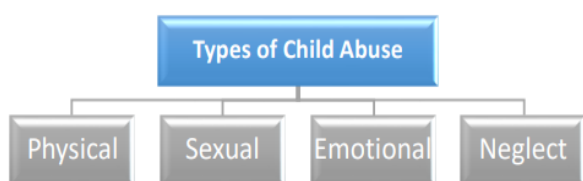




Safeguarding Newsletter – Spring 2025

- Seeking improvement to ensure the school follows best practice in creating a productive and safe environment for all

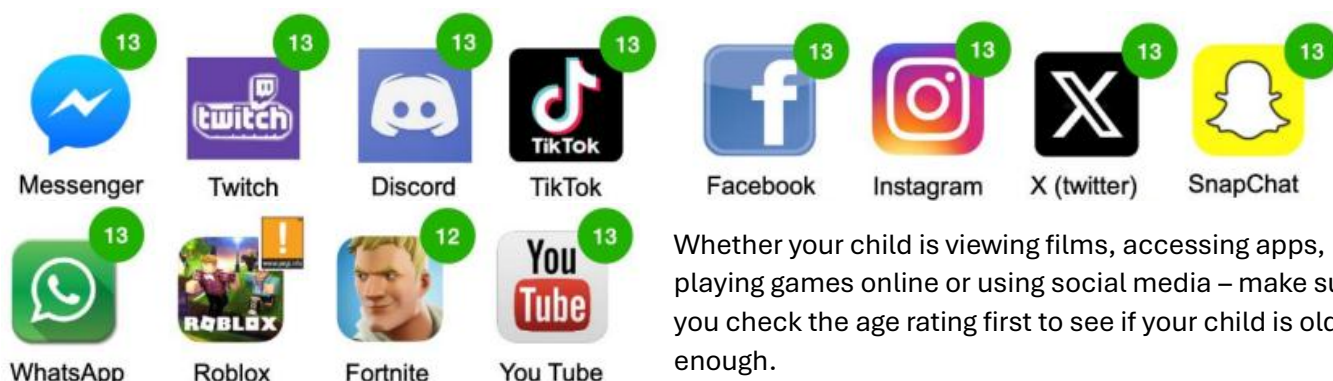
